PROGRAM
OVERVIEW

Delta School offers Extended School Year programs services to students with Emotional Disturbances, Autism/Developmental Disorder and Traumatic Brain Injury.

The Extended School Year (ESY) programs are highly-structured, innovative and supportive environments for students identified with a range of disabilities and needs.

The programs serve students ranging in ages from 6 to 22 years old.

Students will have the opportunity for a modified continuation of their regular school year programming.

IEP goals/objectives and related services are identified specifically through a student's IEP Team for participation to guide each student's ESY program.



PROGRAM
DETAILS

Academic Instruction

Delta School staff consists of highly qualified teachers and para-professionals. Students who attend our program will maintain identified skills within the context of a comprehensive, engaging daily schedule that addresses academic, social and behavioral competencies. Students have a shortened day schedule that provides them with a full spectrum of experiences, including academic instruction, work skills, community-based instruction and therapies that are identified in the students' IEP.

Speech & Language Therapy

Speech and language services are provided according to the students' IEP goals. Communication is approached from a total communication approach, fostering eye gaze, gestures, sign language, leading, picture choices, verbalizations and assistive technology.

Occupational Therapy

OT services are also provided according to the student's IEP goals. Practice and therapy occur in the classroom and in the therapy room.



DATA COLLECTION



Delta School uses the 8-step Process for a measure of monitoring students' progress towards IEP goals and objectives. Our data system is Aims web. Data is collected daily regarding each student's progress on each student's targeted ESY goals. The data is stored in the IEP Writer Progress Monitoring system.

The teachers also provide a narrative summary which provides more information regarding the progress made by the students during the ESY program. Copies of the Delta School ESY Data Collection Summary charts are provided to the parents and school districts at the conclusion of the ESY program.
